# PLANNING

The Parish council hold Planning committee meetings each month specifically for providing comments and feedback to TWBC on planning applications for which the Parish Council are consultees. These meetings are open for the public to attend without prior notification and the Council always welcomes parishioners to such meetings.

### SPEEDING IN THE VILLAGE

Unfortunately, speeding vehicles continue to be a problem in many rural villages and Horsmonden is no exception. The Parish Council agreed to continue two important initiatives to tackle speeding at their meeting on 2<sup>nd</sup> March: Speedwatch and Speed Indicator Devices (SIDs). Speedwatch is run by Kent Police and using the equipment owned by the Parish Council and allows volunteers the opportunity to capture information about individual vehicles which are caught breaking the speed limit in the village. The data is passed on to Kent Police and if a vehicle is registered twice on the police system it will receive a warning letter from Kent Police. The equipment has now been serviced and is in good working condition ready for the volunteers to start using as soon as the weather allows. If you would like to help with Speedwatch please email the Clerk who can put you in contact with the coordinator, Martin Drinkwater. The

PC continue to be very grateful to Martin and all the Speedwatch volunteers for their hard work.

The Speed Indicator Devices (SIDs) also deter speeding by flashing up the speed of all vehicles travelling above 30 MPH though the village . The devices capture and record information about the number and speed of vehicles passing through the village. This information cannot identify individual vehicles and their owners, or be used for prosecution, but it does provide data which the PC stores and can be used to back up requests for assistance from Kent Highways services and the Police, when required.

#### HORSMONDEN PUBLIC TOILETS

Unfortunately, we continue to experience vandalism in the public toilets on a regular basis. You may have noticed that the hand dryer has been removed in the disabled toilet and this is due to a recent incident where it was smashed off the wall and left unrepairable. These items are very expensive to buy and install and due to the continuous problems, particularly in the disabled toilet, the Parish Council have decided to not replace the hand dryer at the moment. We apologise for any inconvenience this may cause to parishioners.

The Parish Council continue to monitor the damages being carried out at the public toilets and consider options for the future, bearing in mind the cost incurred by parishioners to keep these facilities open and in good repair. More information on this will be provided at our Annual Parish Meeting in May. If you do see anyone causing damage to these facilities please do not hesitate to phone 101 and report to Kent Police. We have also made a request for our local PCSO to patrol these facilities as often as their local shifts allow.
