The Parish Council have acted promptly to repair the damage and ensure the toilets remain safe, clean, and welcoming for public use.

## **SPEEDWATCH – CAN YOU HELP?**

Speedwatch is a community-based scheme where volunteers record the speed of passing vehicles in the area where they live. Around 90% of vehicles observed once by Speedwatch volunteers are not seen speeding again in the next 12 months.

We already have an active Speedwatch group in Horsmonden, who do a great job, but they are desperately in need of more volunteers.
