#### **WEST KENT RURAL GRANT SCHEME**

Tunbridge Wells Borough Council are working with Sevenoaks District Council & Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council to distribute £1.28 million of capital funding from Government to projects across our rural towns and countryside.

Grant awards of £2,000-£24,999 are available for projects in the 2024/25 financial year and applications are encouraged from businesses, cultural/heritage and community organisations, and visitor destinations.

This time-limited funding must be spent by **1 March 2025**, so please raise awareness about the grants and encourage anyone interested to contact <u>ruralgrants@sevenoaks.gov.uk</u> who are administering the scheme.
