# REQUEST FOR HELP TO PROTECT A PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY IN THE VILLAGE CENTRE

The Parish Council are still hoping to make an application to Kent County Council to protect a valuable public right of way in the village centre. This footpath extends from the Maidstone Road (next to the Kings Head) around the back of the chemist and out onto the Brenchley Road.

In order to start the application, the Parish Council need to be able to provide evidence that this path has been used by parishioners for the last ten years or more, on a regular basis.

We still require more evidence regarding this so if you have regularly used this path and are willing to sign a statement to say so, please contact the Clerk who will be able to provide you with further details.

## **ROADWORKS – SHARING INFORMATION**

The village and surrounding area are experiencing a lot of disruption due to Kent County Council roadworks. We are advised of them often very close to the date they are taking place. #### LORRY WATCH

If you regularly notice lorries that are using unsuitable roads or not sticking to the limits and restrictions on our local roads, you may wish to consider joining 'Lorry Watch'. This is a scheme run by Kent County Council where information on lorries that are thought to be using unsuitable roads can be collated and passed on to Kent Police for further investigation. Kent Police can find the vehicle's registered keeper and if the vehicle is ignoring the legal limits and restrictions, the police will contact the company and warn them that if they continue it may result in formal action. #### THE QUEEN'S GREEN CANOPY

The Parish Council are delighted to announce that a new tree has now been planted on Fromandez Drive to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee which will take place in June 2022.

The tree is a Hawthorn specimen which fits nicely into the space available and will not grow too large. It will provide blossom and berries to attract and assist wildlife. The tree was provided by TWBC as part of the Queens Green Canopy scheme, where by the Parish Council only pays a 50% of the cost of the tree. The tree will be listed in the official register of the Queen's Green canopy trees and the Parish Council will be adding an official plaque near to the tree to commemorate it's planting. # LASTING IMPRESSIONS – TUNBRIDGE WELLS PANDEMIC QUILTED MEMORY TREE

The Lasting Impressions project is community run by Tunbridge Wells Borough Council, in partnership with Tunbridge Wells Hospital. They are creating a quilted tree wall hanging, with leaves made by members of the local community depicting their memories, reflections, and experiences of living through the Covid-19 pandemic. Everyone in the borough and surrounding area is invited to create and send in their own memory leaf so that it can be included as part of the tree. The quilted memory tree will be displayed at The Amelia when it opens in Spring 2022, before taking up permanent residence at Tunbridge Wells Hospital.
