We would also like to extend our sincere thanks to Cllr Stuart Davis, who has served as Vice Chair for many years. His dedication and service has been greatly appreciated.


We are pleased to confirm that Cllr Davis will continue to serve as a Councillor, along with all other current Councillors who have chosen to remain in their roles.
