UNVEILING OF THE WILLIAM LAMBERT PLAQUE AT THE INSTITUTE BUILDING (SOCIAL CLUB)

On Saturday 24th September, Councillor Jane March, Chair of Horsmonden Parish Council, was pleased to welcome special guest John Summerfield, Great Grandson of William Lambert, to unveil the William Lambert plaque that has been installed on the wall of the Institute Building (Social Club).

Following an introduction about the history of William Lambert in Horsmonden by Councillor March, John spoke briefly about his Lambert family tree then proceeded to unveil the plaque.



The installation of the William Lambert plaque was organised and funded by the Parish Council.

ROADWORKS - SHARING INFORMATION

The village and surrounding area are experiencing a lot of disruption due to Kent County Council roadworks. We are advised of them often very close to the date they are taking place. STREET LIGHTS

The Parish owns more than 40 street lights around the village which require regular checks and repair. Now that the nights are drawing in, please contact us if you notice a street light that is not working and we will

report it to our maintenance engineers for investigation.

Unfortunately owning the street lights also means that we have to pay for the electricity consumption and recent price increases have made it very difficult for us to renegotiate a new electricity supply contract after our current contract came to an end in May. The Council has now managed to secure a contract for 12 months' supply for its street lights with SSE so that at least we can budget with a stable price for the immediate future and can keep our lights on. However, the contract does represent a large increase in costs from previous years.

HORSEFAIR

The Horsefair was originally due to take place on 11 September but was cancelled owing to the sad death of our late Queen. Instead the organisers managed to rearrange the day for 25 September and held a well-attended event which seemed to run smoothly. The Parish Council thanked the organisers for leaving the Green and toilets tidy.

VILLAGE GREEN – UPCOMING EVENTS

We are pleased to confirm that HoVEC has booked the Village Green for some exciting events for us all to look forward to in December.

Without spoiling the surprise- we can announce that there will be a Winter festival from 2nd-4th December which will include a Christmas market and other events, to be held in a marquee.

We have been experiencing some vandalism in the public toilets recently where toilets and sinks have been blocked with rubbish causing flooding and an unpleasant mess on the floor.

Our new cleaning contractor has made a great effort to improve the appearance and cleanliness of the toilets

so it is very disappointing that we are still experiencing these problems on a regular basis.
