UNVEILING OF THE WILLIAM LAMBERT PLAQUE AT THE INSTITUTE BUILDING (SOCIAL CLUB)

By the time of publishing, the unveiling of the William Lambert Plaque at the Institute Building will have taken place.

On the 24th September 2022, the Parish Council invited John Summerfield, William Lambert's Great Grandson as their guest of honour to unveil the newly situated plaque.



The plaque (1893) commemorates William Lambert, known as the maker of steam engines in the village. William died on the 1st April 1916 in his home, Hill House in Castle Hill and was buried at St Margaret's Church in Horsmonden.

We hope you agree that the plaque looks right at home in its new position.
